

## Internships and External Projects

As part of a structural development, the field of international internships has been reorganized. Responsibility now lies with the Head of Internship Affairs & Quality Development Mag.a Stella Becher-Urbaniak, while Lisa Weiß supports the process in her role as coordinator. The aim of this restructuring is to further enhance the quality of internships and to ensure reliable and transparent support for all students.

Currently, the following cooperation partners and internship opportunities are available and are **exclusively coordinated and administered through our clinic team:**

- Haus Jaro (focus: working with homeless individuals)
- SFU Outpatient Clinic (focus: treatment of moderate to severe mental health conditions)
- ÖZP Outpatient Clinic (focus: treatment of moderate to severe mental health conditions)
- Migration in Psychotherapy – Outpatient Clinic & PTW Faculty

At the same time, we are actively working on expanding our network and establishing new partnerships in order to create additional and diverse internship opportunities.

A central aspect of our work is the continuous development and safeguarding of internship quality. In this context, we also serve as a point of contact for feedback, concerns, and complaints, which are systematically integrated into our quality development processes.
